

Clark J. Kidd

Clark J. Kidd, 67, our beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend, died at Logan Regional Hospital June 13, 1997, following a cardiac arrest. He was born in a log cabin in Farnum,



Idaho, Oct. 11, 1929, to George C. and Minnie J. Kidd. The youngest of five children, he grew up in the Ashton, Idaho, area later moving with his father and mother to San Jose, Calif., for his father's health. His father passed away in November of 1994. Clark and his mother moved to Logan for a short period of time where he attended school while waiting for his brother, Jack's (George C.) release from the Air Force. They all returned to Ashton, Idaho, where Jack and Clark purchased and operated a small service station. His mother died in July 1947.

He was called to serve a mission for the LDS Church to the East Central states in December of 1949. He married Marilyn M. Lee in the Idaho Falls LDS Temple Aug. 29, 1952. He was drafted into the army in January 1953, and served to October 1954, when they returned to Logan and he pursued his education at Utah State University. Clark was employed at USU Printing Services where he eventually became director of the department and worked for 30 years, retiring in December, 1986.

He was always active in the LDS Church and served in many leadership positions and in various auxiliaries. He has enjoyed having time to write his history and work on his genealogy and family ties. He and Marilyn were serving a work mission for the church at the time of his passing.

He was preceded in death by his parents; and one brother, Fern (Elizabeth) Kidd.
