

George Clement Kidd's Obituary



George C. Kidd, Ashton Resident, Dies on Coast

ASHTON, Nov. 22. — George Clement Kidd, 57, of Ashton, died Saturday of a heart attack at San Jose, Calif., where he had been living the last few months.

Funeral services will be held Thursday, at the LDS chapel in Ashton, with Bishop Floyd Blanchard in charge.

Mr. Kidd was born May 8, 1887, at Manchester, Tenn. He came west in 1906, and settled in Cache valley, Utah, where he was united in marriage with Minnie Obrey

Jackson January 2, 1913, in the Logan LDS temple.

Later the couple made their home in Lost river valley, moving to Drummond in 1913. They have lived in this part of Idaho since.

Besides his widow he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Nelda MacPherson of Salmon and four sons, Austin Fern Kidd, Earl Clement Kidd and Clark Jackson Kidd, all of Ashton, and A/C George Jackson Kidd of U. S. army air corps, San Marcos, Tex., and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Jack Bresock and Walter Kidd of Layton, Utah; Lawrence Kidd of Idaho Falls; Hobson Kidd of Stockton, Calif., and Henry Kidd of Marysville.

The L. T. Kiser mortuary of Ashton will be in charge. Interment will be in Pineview cemetery.
